I am not the biggest fan of The Stone Roses but it turns out I was at their first ever gig. So, a mate of mine told me that I should share my story and I was pointed in your direction. So here we go. You can have this.

It was the first time I saw Pete Townshend live and I was (and still am) an avid fan of The Who, but before I seen him I waited anxiously and watched the support group. Recently I found out that they were a little known group called The Stone Roses. They turned out to be the biggest band of their generation. I remember very little of their set. But I can remember them like The Cure. I remember how the singer was in charge of the stage. That was a week after I turned 17 and not only did I manage to see my hero, Pete Townshend for the first time but I managed to see, possibly the inventors of Brit-pop and saviours of British guitar rock, The Stone Roses. I saw the Stone Roses at Leicester many years later and there was a difference but more memory with the latter.

I was speaking to a friend in Brussels who did have photos of The Stone Roses live at the Moonlight in 1984 but sold them around 1995 to a collector in London for £700.

The evening culminated in a jam session involving Pete Townshend, Reni and members of High Noon, performing 'Pictures of Lily', 'Substitute' and 'The Kids Are Alright'.

Information:

The Stone Roses' first ever gig was a high profile one. Ian saw an ad in Sounds magazine that asked for bands to take part in an anti-heroin benefit in support of Pete Townshend's Double O Charity. He sent a demo tape to Caroline Read, manager of post-punk outfit Mercenary Skank, who was suitably impressed and duly booked the band for this, their first ever gig. Ian claimed that the band had a significant following when in truth, they had yet to emerge from the recording studio, and appealed to the organisers' sense of civic duty, writing 'I'm surrounded by skag heads. I wanna smash 'em. Can you give us a show ?' Following the performance, Reed briefly became manager of the band and booked them for a couple of London shows before Howard Jones became their full-time manager.

Reni impressed 'special guest star' Pete Townshend so much that Townshend invited him back on stage to perform on 'Substitute' and 'Pictures of Lily'. The Stone Roses were in on the identity of the 'special guest star', through meeting and correspondence with Reed a month prior to the London show. Townshend had recently returned from the US, playing to 50,000 people with The Who at Shea Stadium, and was looking out for guitarists and a drummer. Townshend was highly impressed by Reni and the other Roses became concerned that he would poach their most naturally talented musical member: "We were like, 'Shit, Reni's gonna leave. Townshend's nicking Reni.'"

This gig was an eventful one, with music (Andy Couzens' guitar packed up) and crowd problems, ending in a mini riot after three songs. Ian pleaded with the crowd to stop fighting but afterwards refused to condemn the violence to journalist Ro Newton, leading her to give an unpleasant review of the band in Melody Maker ("Imagine the sound of fingernails scraping down a blackboard, amplified to an intolerable degree...The Stone Roses are tuning up." She summarises the evening as a "pitiful display."). As ex-manager Howard Jones explained: "We were getting a really bad reputation and the problem was that it was deserved. I knew that we would have trouble playing anywhere in Britain, after that."

There was an earlier gig at Manchester University than the one in November 1985. It must have been sometime in the spring of '85, and instead of being in the large hall downstairs it was on the second floor in a much smaller room. I don't think there were more than around 50 people there. They were still aiming for a sound not all that far from punk at that stage. At later gigs, 'So Young' and 'Tell Me' gradually sounded more and more out of place alongside the other songs, but at this gig the songs were all that kind of mood.

The second time I saw them would have been the 10 May 1985 gig at Manchester International, but I drank so much that I had to leave before they came on. Ended up punching my hand through the door at my rented pad because I couldn't find my key. I later discovered that it had been in my pocket all along.

I can't remember if I went to that 22 November 1985 Manchester University gig, but I was at the second warehouse party (30 November 1985 aka 'Manchester Flower Show 2'). I remember my friend saying that there had been another one over the summer. After the generator blew, Reni threw one of his drums through the window. One of the others trashed his guitar. Catherine Walsh's eyewitness report on the first warehouse gig mentions tickets with pennies taped to the back. Well, they did that at the second one too. I think I still have mine somewhere.

I returned to Manchester in November 1987 for that Manchester International gig (13 November). The first song, 'Sally Cinnamon', was way out of tune. They got it together after that. The same can't be said for my friends and I, who sat glued to the same seats for most of the night. It was my one and only experience of acid, and the skies had gone purple as we walked there. By the time we arrived, we could no longer form complete sentences. A good time was had by all.

1985 ... I teased my hair until it stuck out enough for a bird to nest in it, black extensions cascading down my back, bits of tatty ribbon tied here and there. My dress carefully torn just so, ripped fishnets and too much jewellery.

My brother dressed in Bauhaus black, we picked Kate our friend up who was a punk rocker. We had got our tickets from Steve Adge, a Rockabilly, "Daddy Adge", who was a regular at the Ritz on alternative night. I remember the ticket had a penny carefully sellotaped to the small bit of paper - "A penny back" the ticket said.

We met outside an old warehouse on Fairfield St, Manchester. Inside was... well, a basic run of the mill warehouse. My first illegal warehouse party and my first Roses gig. It was so cold but the excitement made me forget, I stood near the one and only heater. I overheard someone say, "They will do really well, especially as the band's singer is so good looking, top front man !"

We met up with my boyfriend Rob Hampson (Rob the Bob) mingling amongst the punks and rockabillys. We danced around a little, Manchester's cool were dancing to Joy Division, Smiths, Bunnymen, The Fall, Bow Wow Wow and so off we went jumping and shuffling about on the stone floor.

About 3am a group of young, skinny boys set up their rig at the front of a room off from the main warehouse. There was no stage so we got as close as we liked. The young Ian and his band played their early tracks - there were not many, and we wanted more !

Andy Couzens' last gig, to a heavy metal dominated audience, ended in a riot. Couzens playing the riff from Deep Purple's 'Smoke on the Water' was the catalyst; the crowd didn't take kindly to this, thinking this Beach Boys-esque attired band in their striped black & white shirts were having a laugh at their expense. The band promptly retreated to the dressing room, where the club manager refused to pay for their appearance. The Stone Roses pugnaciously responded: "You either pay us or we go out there and the place gets trashed." Couzens flew home the following day rather than catching a ferry with the rest of the band.

The Stone Roses supported my band, Innervision (Ken Kelly. Frank Perry. Mark Jennings. Rob Carubia.)

With all the excitement surrounding The Stone Roses' return and sell out dates over the last few weeks I have decided to do my first ever blog surrounding my own band (Innervision) appearance with The Stone Roses back in 1986. This last week I have been contacted by several friends, ex band members and a journalist as everyone seems to be writing a new book on The Stone Roses and wants any past info on the band. I also needed to correct some information once and for all as nobody seems to know the exact date of the gig. The date was 11th August 1986 although the original date had to be changed at least once on the request of The Stone Roses' manager. I'd played at the venue 2 or 3 times that year and if it wasn't for photos, tickets and posters then I'd be confused as well. Most of the Stone Roses websites, books, biographies etc seem to list this gig as the 11th August or with a question mark except it seems for journalist John Robb whom I've been told lists it as late 1986 with the support band being the Danny Boys in his book about The Stone Roses. While John has always come across on TV or Radio as a well informed and thoroughly decent guy I have to inform him that he is completely wrong and needs to change some of the details in his book. There was only one gig in Liverpool with The Stone Roses in 1986 and the band playing that night with The Stone Roses was my band Innervision.

Around about June 1986 Innervision had parted company with several members due to the usual musical differences and now consisted of only myself Ken Kelly and Frank Perry as the ever present song writing team. Knowing that we had a following and especially in Liverpool having just played to a sell out crowd at The Mardi Gras club a few months earlier on the 14th February I wasn't surprised by the phone call I was about to get from The Stone Roses' manager Gareth Evans. I very soon found out that Gareth not only managed The Stone Roses but also ran the International club in Manchester as well as a record label. It turned out that Gareth had some major record companies interested in The Stone Roses but these companies wanted to see them play live outside of Manchester to prove they had a

following elsewhere. Somebody had informed Gareth that I ran a record label in Liverpool and that I also had a band with a following that had very recently managed to fill the Mardi Gras club. Gareth's suggestion was that Innervision should do a gig with The Stone Roses at The Mardi Gras club as this would be beneficial to both bands with major record companies in attendance.

The suggestion was to pool resources and that the gig on the 11th August was to be followed by a return gig with The Stone Roses at the International the following month on the 22nd September. The only problem was that Innervision was temporarily two members short and I was in the middle of work producing a 10 track compilation LP Modesty Kills which was to be Audio Visual Records debut release. A hastily arranged meeting with fellow songwriting partner Frank Perry took place in the fruit and veg section of the now defunct Lewis's in Liverpool where he worked and we decided we could assemble a new band line up in the 3 weeks that we had. A second keyboard player in the shape of Mark Jennings was brought in as well as the multi instrumental Rob Carubia who managed to learn all our songs in a few days. In the days running up to the gig I managed to rearrange the posters from our Feb 14th Mardi Gig in to A4 flyers and A3 posters to include The Stone Roses and then set about plastering the whole of Liverpool city centre and beyond with them. My girlfriend at the time worked at the university publishers and would help with typesetting and printing in her lunch breaks. This was at a time when few people owned a word processor let alone a computer and this proved to be very helpful in getting posters and flyers turned around quickly. The poster had our trademark boy with the weird eyes on it but listed The Stone Roses as support as had been discussed.

During the original phone conversation with Gareth he had suggested that The Stone Roses would play first and Innervision would headline as this was our neck of the woods. There seemed to be more concern around ensuring a decent sized crowd attended as to suggest The Stone Roses following was growing outside of Manchester. For most of the 80s and into the 90s it was well known that in Liverpool and Manchester there was a sort of cartel controlling major fly posting and that you were not to fly post over the major gig posters or there would be trouble. So with about three days to go before the gig I was a little surprised to say the least when what appeared at least to me to be the biggest poster I had ever seen with our band name on it all over the city. That surprise quickly turned to anger when I noticed that The Stone Roses were in massive letters on the poster with the words 'support from Innervision' in much smaller letters underneath. After some ranting down the phone I was told it was really a double headline show but it had to appear that The Stone Roses were the bigger band (work that one out). In return for going with this I was told Innervision would be the headline at the International club in Manchester the following month with The Stone Roses - a gig that was heavily advertised at the time but we refused to do unless we were paid first. We weren't paid and we didn't play. This subsequently meant we did no more dates with The Stone Roses.

As always, I tried to make sure the entire band was together at the venue as early as possible for the soundcheck and that we were sounding as tight as

possible given whatever the PA and club arrangements were. If I remember correctly there was usually an in house PA at the Mardi Gras club at the time and although it wasn't the best it was decent enough. I think Frank Perry and Mark Jennings arrived at the club around 6pm without Rob Carubia who was running late. I'd been there since about 5pm, having had extra involvement in the organisation of the gig and was again surprised to find a bigger PA system and sound engineer already on site which I can only assume had been organised by The Stone Roses' manager Gareth Evans. Given the chaos that followed in subsequent years with the band it now seems even more amazing to be told on arrival that The Stone Roses had done their soundcheck and left for something to eat. They definitely seemed organised and well prepared for the gig.

If I'm being perfectly honest I didn't know too much about the band back in '86 apart from the fact they were getting some good write ups in the music press and causing a bit of a stir especially in and around Manchester. There was certainly no hint of how big things were going to go for them in the next few years. Of course there will always be someone who says they followed them from the start and knew they were going to be the biggest band in the world but I was there chatting with them, sharing the stage with them and I knew hardly anything about them. You just don't know who is going to be a massive success tomorrow but there I was standing near the staircase in the Mardi Gras club checking sound levels when Ian Brown knocks me on the shoulder and says thanks for doing the gig Ken. No arrogance, no funny business, just genuinely friendly. The rest of The Stone Roses were all stood together near the top of the club stairs in solidarity which again seems nothing like what was to follow but that is how it was. At this point having shook Ian's hand and realised they had watched the end of our sound check I didn't care who went on stage first. I just had a feeling it was going to be a good night and a good gig. Ian said they were leaving to meet somebody and would be back in time to catch our set and they left. The ice was well and truly broken.

I think we went on stage around about 9 to 9.30pm with maybe around about 100 fans at the venue and nowhere near the packed club we'd had for our gig a few months earlier in February. This was due in part to it being a week day, having to find new members quite quickly and only having a month to drum up support for the gig but I'd say 80% of the crowd were people we knew or who had supported us previously. A few songs into our set it was noticeable towards the back of the crowd that another 15 or 20 people had just come in to the venue having just arrived by mini bus from Manchester. They were already a bit worse for wear and very noisy but it definitely added to the atmosphere in a positive way and helped liven up the already assembled crowd to get behind us more. With just 4 songs left of our set and still no sign of The Stone Roses I thanked people for turning out for the gig and introduced our song Reincarnation before seeing Ian Brown and the rest of The Stone Roses arrive at the back of the club. They shook hands with a few of their friends who had arrived with the late party, some of whom I am now reliably informed were members of The Happy Mondays although I didn't know that at the time. We finished our set to good applause and shouts for an encore. We were about to do two more songs including a new one when someone from

the club said we could only do one more song or we'd be cutting down the amount of time The Stone Roses had on stage so this was to be our last song. We came off to great applause eventually reaching the back of the club where Ian Brown greeted me with a "good gig mate" even though I knew the band had only been back in the club for the last 4 songs and the encore but I appreciated the fact they had seen a portion of what we were about which was far different musically to The Stone Roses with lots more electronics.

The Stone Roses arrive on stage.

At this point I'd had all my chats and given thanks to friends who came out to support us that night. I decided to settle down at the side of the stage where our equipment had now been moved to and see what this band The Stone Roses were all about while finishing off our free cans of lager from the club. I had just said my goodbyes to photographer and good friend Ian Stading (who would later join the band and take photos for my album covers) who had managed to take quite a few photos of us on stage with all of The Stone Roses equipment around us notably Alan "Reni" Wren's drums. He would take lots of extra pictures of anything and everything just in case it was that special photo but that night he left without taking any photos of The Stone Roses on stage. A mistake he probably doesn't want reminding of. I'm just glad to this day that many of my friends witnessed that gig, that I kept some of the posters and flyers and that Ian documented my band on stage with all of The Stone Roses' equipment and Reni's drums. The rest of the night is remembered in snippets as my free drinks were now well and truly kicking in.

I remember sitting on the side of the stage thinking how good the guitarist was, how loud they were and how much use they were making of the PA that night (probably far too big for the venue). I remember just how confident they were and how cool they acted. This band meant business. I looked down and Ian Brown was wriggling on the floor with the microphone over his head and then it happened. I'd not seen this band before and I felt for him when he opened his mouth and hit that first note as flat as a pancake. I thought we've all been there before and hit a duff note at the wrong time. He'd been OK with me and I'd just shared the stage with him and I wanted him to get back in tune but alas it didn't happen. The important thing was that the band worked as a unit and the sound and vocals worked as a unit. There was no denying that the band had something special and that Ian Brown as a front man had something very special that went way beyond just vocals. I left shortly before the end of the club's cut off point for music and what must have been a few songs short of the end of their set. The club was now half empty with many of my friends and our band's fans having left. Our gear and equipment was in the van and I was being offered a lift home so reluctantly I decided to go with the intention of phoning Gareth Evans the next day to ask about our gig at The International the following month with The Stone Roses.

Below are flyers front and back for September through to November's gig dates at The International Manchester. The flyer shows the Innervision return date as Monday 22nd September 1986 as reward for playing the Stone Roses gig at the Liverpool Mardi Gras club in August. This is the gig we refused to

do after a financial disagreement with the Stone Roses manager. Notably we had been given another Monday night just as we had done for The Stone Roses gig in Liverpool and always a difficult night to get people to attend following the weekend. Also interesting to see who was playing the venue at the time: The Chameleons, Furniture, Balaam & The Angel, World Party, The Mighty Lemon Drops, Loudon Wainwright and The Robert Cray Band to name but a few and all priced between £1.00 and £5.00.

The next few days passed and it was clear that I was either only managing to phone Gareth Evans when he was out of his office or he didn't want to speak to me. Eventually Gareth sent me some details of our gig at the International Manchester on the 22nd September 1986 (See flyer - Innervision + guests). True to his word we were the headline and we had a support band but no mention of The Stone Roses playing the gig with us this time. He told us The Stone Roses were playing a different venue in Manchester now but in October or November as they had become much bigger. "What, in a month?" I said. "Precisely", he said and that is why you'll only be getting petrol money and expenses for your gig. "We won't do it" I told him and furthermore I wanted payment in full up front before the gig or we wouldn't turn up. He laughed and told me that we would turn up because it's a prestige gig and it's good for your band. We didn't turn up, he shouted down the phone hours before the gig and that was the end of our involvement with Gareth Evans, The Stone Roses and The International club in Manchester. What happened next is as they say history but we had our day, we were there and Mr Robb unless The Stone Roses did manage to do another secret gig at the end of 1986 in Liverpool then you need to change some details and dates in your book because this was the only gig I know about. I was there. I rest my case.

At the time, 'Elephant Stone' and 'Sally Cinnamon' were the only tracks most people were familiar with. Both tracks received heavy playing at most Manchester indie nights - led of course by Dave Haslam and his Thursday night temperance club at the Hacienda.

So these are the only tracks I remember them playing and getting down and dancing to, and the only tracks that really got the place going - compared to what was to come. Gigs pre-Madchester consisted of either the standing and appreciating type or the rucking down the front types and this was neither - it was genuine grooving.

The International 2 was pretty packed with a mix of students, 'Mancs' and professional Manchester music scene types. I don't think it was a sell out though as there were tickets on the door and the International 2 was a good-sized venue - the likes of Public Enemy played there in 1988. However, there was generally a bit of a buzz around the place and a determination to have a good time, whatever your tippie. The friend I went with had urged more people to go, saying it was going to be a 'big' night. He said that the NME were there and various A'n'R music business types, but quite how he knew I don't know - and I don't remember there being a review in the NME.

As for the performance - they certainly had attitude. Ian didn't speak to the audience and the band were straight off with no encore - the sort of stunt that only super cool New Order pulled at that time. One other stupid thing I remember is the gantry bar. The band seemed to have invested in a large lighting gantry thing - which was too big for the venue and was placed at an angle across the back of the stage. Strange, but the look added to the air of difference. You would have thought given that their manager owned the International that they would have known how big the stage was?

I had a large fly poster for the gig I nicked for a while - but it has probably gone now. I am sure however that in the attic are some pretty cool Hacienda flyers I kept.

First saw them in 1987 just after Tell Me was released, used to go round clubs in Manchester with my mate checking out local bands, but as soon as we saw the Roses we knew they were something special. They used to play the International, then the International II almost monthly it seemed. Started following them round the shit-holes of the North West, St Helens Citadel, Legends in Warrington, Lancaster Poly etc. They toured around the time the first album came out, they played Manchester early on in the tour, but as the buzz round the album and tour grew bigger they arranged an end of tour extra date at the International II, early May 1989. Without doubt their best ever gig, even above Blackpool. For about the first time you actually needed a ticket to get in. Usually if you didn't have one you just paid an extra pound on the night. But this night was sold out in advance. Although we had tickets, we were refused entry initially because the place was too full due to bouncers letting people in, in exchange for tenners. In the end people inside kicked open the fire exits to let some air in, and everyone outside just piled in. Several people were getting crushed, including Tony Wilson, who had a look of sheer panic on his face. In retrospect I've no idea what the sound quality was like, you could hardly hear the band over the sound of the crowd, but as for the atmosphere, it was unbelievable.

Went to Blackpool, Alexandra Palace and Spike Island after that, and several gigs on the comeback tour, but never seemed to hit the same heights; the music may have been as good, possibly better, but the old madness seemed to have gone. Top memories though.

First of all when Ian says "Sit down...", he's talking to Darrel the bouncer. Darrel was trying to chuck people off the stage. Ian was sitting down on stage playing the maracas and singing, and had about 20 people sitting around him on stage. I was standing on one of the PA speakers on the left hand side. Darrel was trying to pull me down into the crowd - that's what Ian means by 'calm down...'

Ian didn't mind the closeness of the crowd - it all added up to a really special evening. There were no fights, the crowd were lively but there was a good atmosphere.

The first thing that comes to mind is my mate and guitarist in our band coming into our local about 8 o'clock on a Saturday night saying, "Let's get a taxi over to J10 as The Stone Roses were on and they were going to be shit-hot." The queue to get in the place was quite large, it was obvious that word and the quality of the album had got around, but it was still a pay-on-the-door event.

I can't remember a support band (if there even was one). Living just a mile or so away we used to go down there quite frequently as it was a place to have a drink a bit later after the pub had shut! Certainly the crowd in there that night was different to the Pop Will Eat Itself / Wonder Stuff bratty mummies boys from the posh parts of Walsall (there are some), or the gormless rocker types who were the main kind of clientele at the time.

There were loads of geezers wearing flared jeans and baggy t-shirts and the standard bucket hats - these people were obviously from out of town, and accents at the bar confirmed this.

The songs that stand out for me were I Wanna Be Adored, the opener, with its slow bass intro, Waterfall, and Resurrection at the end. Being a bass player in a local band at the time I was really impressed with Mani's bass playing - I am sure he used a Squire-painted Rickenbacker, obviously the drums and guitar were bang on.

Det började hyfsat. Tre låtar från ganska exakt sex år gamla, självbetitlade debutalbumet. Ett album som snabbt fick klassikerstatus hemma i England och nu utgör en av standardreferenserna bland unga brittiska popband.

I Wanna Be Adored, She Bangs the Drums, Waterfall - en treklöver låtar som är få band förunnad. Allt vore frid och fröjd, om inte Ian Brown vore så katastrofalt väck. Den redan i normala fall släpiga rösten vägrar orientera sig rätt och Brown sjunger i fel tonart så att till och med den mest inbitna Stone Roses-fan skruvar på sig.

Bandet är oinspirerat och trött. Tänk tillbaka på Primal Screams pinsamma framträdande i fjolår. Är det en nyinstiftad tradition bland helgonförklarade brittiska rockband att strunta i Kårenspelningarna?

konkurrensen underifrån (Oasis, Suede, Blur och så vidare) snabbt förvandlats till konkurrens uppifrån är det läge att göra sitt bästa.

Nu är smakdomarna hemflugna och Göteborg fick bli en mellanspelning, en ren rutinaffär. Under sådana förhållanden märks också tydligt att mycket av materialet från senaste plattan, *Second Coming*, inte fungerar på scen om bandet inte ger sig hän. Om ens då. John Squire är förbluffande feg i sitt gitarrspel. Han plockar försiktigt på strängarna och verkar inte veta om han ska låta vågskålarna tippa över på den tungrocksida Roses nu storögt flirtar med.

Han river ut en Page ur Led Zeppelins riffbok men vare sig fullföljer tankegången eller lyckas inkorporera Stone Roses popsida på ett balanserat sätt. Då hjälper det inte att de mer Manchesterfunkiga numren visar att nye trummisen Robert Maddix mycket väl kan vara en värdig efterföljare till nyligen avhoppade Reni.

Passande utgångsmusik efter konserten hade varit Rolling Stones-låten *Dead Flowers*. Så visset kändes det.

The crowd's patience was pushed to the limits and it was a relief when the Second Coming intro started. John came on with wild feedback. They then went into Adored, the sound was deafening and totally distorted. The acoustics at the Metropol are normally bad, but this was almost embarrassing. To top it all, Ian was totally out of tune during the first three songs, maybe he couldn't hear himself.

John seemed to steer Robbie through the songs, he turned to him quite often to indicate changes. Robbie seemed to be more comfortable with the new songs and that's when the band started to rock. I remember Begging You was excellent.

All in all, I'd say it was a disappointing gig. Ian's vocals spoilt it and he didn't seem to care. Sadly, like many British bands playing smaller venues in Europe, they seemed arrogant and didn't make an effort to win the crowd over. The highlights were John's solo on Driving South and Mani hanging around in front of the stage after the gig. He signed my ticket and was really friendly. The light show was good, but overall I'd say they were under-rehearsed.

I won't allow my thoughts to be warped by the overwhelmingly negative reviews that those first nights of the Second Coming tour received (although I've never come across any other accounts of this date). Perhaps this gig, like their show in Madrid a few days later, was a success, vocally spot-on and musically tight. I can't answer that and neither would I want to, as to me the Roses were always about much more than that anyway! Perhaps it was down to the crowd and the atmosphere in the place, this German gig was swarming with Brits eager to ensure an enjoyable night was had, totally up for it! Chants of 'Manchesta, Manchesta' rang out between tracks, with the whole place going mad to all the Roses classics.

Ok, so perhaps my memory ain't crystal clear and at the time I stupidly made no record of the set list. Their debut album tunes; 'Adored', 'Waterfall', 'She Bangs The Drums' and 'Resurrection' were probably best received, but the place rocked just as much for the new songs, for sure. We may have had over five years to listen to 'The Stone Roses' but we had had almost five months to listen to 'The Second Coming' and for most people there that night the Second Coming had finally arrived, albeit without Reni, but Robbie Maddix was spot-on!! The songs definitely sounded right anyway!

I clearly remember wishing the gig would never end, that we'd be treated to 'Fool's Gold' or 'One Love' or maybe even an early track! I guess I knew we wouldn't.

I also remember leaving the gig feeling ecstatic yet deflated...an amazing night, an amazing gig!! A gig I had waited five years for and might have to wait another five years to experience again...

...little did I know!

I was at the Toronto show, and let me tell you, it shook my faith in the Roses. I'd waited patiently for years for them to get their act together and come to Canada, and when they finally did, I wished they'd stayed in England.

The doors opened HOURS before the band took the stage, which wouldn't have been so bad if there'd been an opening act. At least they played great tunes over the loudspeaker. Anyway, when the Roses finally decided to grace us with their presence, the sound was horrible. So horrible, in fact, that Ian stopped Waterfall halfway through because he couldn't hear himself. That was the first (and last) time I'd ever seen a professional band stop a song and start again. I felt embarrassed for them, which is strange, 'cause Ian didn't seem to care one bit. In fact, during the chorus to She Bangs The Drums, Ian didn't even bother to sing. He just stalked around the stage shaking his tambourine. It was the most bizarre thing I'd ever seen. Here was a professional singer standing in front of a few thousand adoring fans, and he can't be arsed to sing the chorus to his own song. Which is just as good, because the other twelve songs that he did manage to sing were a shambles. No matter how cool Ian Brown is (and let's face it - he's pretty cool), he's not much of a singer on the best of nights. And this was not one of his best nights.

Keep in mind that before the show, I was walking on air. In just a few hours, I was about to see my favourite band. Every single person that I talked to at the show felt exactly the same way. As we all filed out of the venue after the lights came back on, murmurs of "disgrace" and "I can't believe we waited four years for that" could be heard all around. What a massive, massive letdown.

And was very disappointed it did not go off (even more pissed off at what one of their handlers said - "America doesn't deserve them" - not sure if it is an accurate quote...but it sure set them back a bit here?)

Anyhow, I initially was going to head to the show alone, when a few friends showed interest about seeing the band of whom I spoke so highly of, so they joined in. So there was 5-6 of us. We arrived early and proceeded to head to The Frolic Room, (yes the bar in the Moby video does exist) in Hollywood on Hollywood Blvd, next to the Pantages..a very cool place to have a few before the show by the way..

We headed to the show and after seeing numerous shows at the Palladium, knew it would be small and intimate (there are no seats on the main floor). I was surprised that they opened with one of their hits...Adored, and wondered if they would peak too soon? This was not to be the case as they tore through a very tight set of songs (save for an Ian Brown restart and Peter Brady like voice crack). The sound was a bit bassy but not too bad. The new drummer was not as polished as Reni, but had not played in the band as long...so a bit a slack was cut there..he was very good, but Reni is amazing, hard to fill his shoes. Or tennis hat ;-)

I can recall being close to the mosh pit and having teeny boppers wanting me to lift them up, which I did once and was promptly kicked in the head, so being the smart person I am, I slid around the side and had a great view of John Squire..he was terrific. More beers ensued at the show and my only disappointment was that the set was a little short. After the show we tried to get backstage, someone right in front of us did. I have read reviews that the band was smoking enough ganja to join a reggae band backstage...perhaps this was why Ian's voice wasn't as sharp as it could have been?

All in all, I was very glad to finally see the band after listening to their all to few CDs for years...my colleagues all said that the band did indeed live up to prior

billing, so there was a sort of redemption on my part. As I left I knew that this would be the one and only time I would see the band...I just had a strange vibe that they would not be around long, and as it turns out, I was right.

Well, I finally decided to write a review of this show before I forgot any more details. It's been a while so I may not be 100% correct on all points but here's what I remember.

The day that tickets were announced, my friend and I decided to go wait outside Tower Records at around 7 in the morning. When we actually got there, we were disappointed to find out there were already 20 or so people in line. So we waited and waited and when we finally got to buy the tickets we found out that everyone in line was actually there to buy tickets for the Beastie Boys show which was also going on sale that day. Tickets in hand, we left the record store and went back to sleep.

On the day before the actual show I talked to my friend in LA who had seen them the day before in Los Angeles. Unfortunately, he said they were pretty awful. He was also at Blackpool in 1989 and said they were way worse this time. I had also been reading lots of gig reports on the Stone Roses mailing list and most of them varied but a lot of them were saying how bad Ian Brown was. And of course, there had been several British musical periodicals which had completely slagged them off during the European tour. So I don't think it's a stretch to say here that I wasn't expecting much.

When the day of the show finally arrived, we headed off to the Fillmore. The first thing I remember thinking when I entered the auditorium was how weird it was that they had a barrier up between the audience area and the stage. I've seen around 30+ shows at the Fillmore and I'd never seen a barrier there before, nor have I seen one since. The other thing I noticed was that the curtains were covered in silver glittery foil which looked a bit strange. But anyway, my friends and I picked a spot on the floor and proceeded to wait. I wanted a spot near where John Squire was going to be so we sat on stage left near his amp. As far as we knew, there was no opening band, so we had no idea when they were coming on, but I do remember waiting there on the floor for a very long time. When the lights finally went out, everyone stood up in anticipation, but I think even after that we waited another 20 minutes. And when the Roses FINALLY came on, there was this massive surge in the

crowd as everyone pushed forward. I think at one point I was actually being suspended off the ground between several people.

They started with 'I Wanna Be Adored' and just hearing that bassline made me feel like I was in high school again. The Roses first album had come out when I was a senior in high school and at the time of this show I had been out of college for a year. So a lot had changed for me, personally, in that time. But seeing Squire play that opening and hearing Mani play that bassline (I couldn't actually see Mani) just took me back to 1989/90 all over again. Ian was wearing some kind of funky kung-fu outfit and kept jumping up and down. I was half expecting him to start kicking things.

Since I had been reading the other setlists from the American shows on the mailing list, I knew the rough order of the evening's setlist. Still, it was such a thrill to hear them run through 'She Bangs the Drums' and 'Waterfall' and the others.. I remember during the 'Waterfall' solo they turned down the lights and Ian Brown shone a flashlight into the audience.

One of the other things I remember about the show is that their lighting rig caught on fire during the 'Daybreak' solo. Squire was playing the solo and yelling at some guy offstage to come do something about the fire. I think it was his guitar tech that ended up running onto the stage and putting out the fire with a fire extinguisher or something. And of course, I remember thinking "wow, this guitar solo sure is going on for a long time". The girl next to me kept yelling for 'Sally Cinnamon' between songs and I remember thinking that it would have been pretty funny to hear Squire solo for 5 minutes during "Sally Cinnamon". But of course, they didn't play that one.

When the show was over, everyone stayed and kept cheering for an encore. To my surprise, Ian Brown actually came out, but only to announce to the crowd that they couldn't do an encore because Mani's finger was busted. People were saying that the encore was going to be 'Fool's Gold', and I remember several people yelling to Ian that they'd play the bass. The house lights came back on and we left the Fillmore after grabbing one of the free posters. I remember being disappointed that it was some weird Indian-themed print and not a Squire painting but I ended up keeping the poster anyways. I eventually gave it to a girl that I later broke up with, but that's another story all together. I found out later that my friend Phil had stayed behind at the Fillmore because his girlfriend had gotten sick during the show. When he and his girlfriend walked back down from the infirmary the show was over but they ran into Mani who asked where he could get smashed.

After the show my friends and I went to get some coffee and dessert at a local restaurant and I was thinking how strange it was that I had finally seen The Stone Roses. Since they had never come anywhere near North America since the first album had come out, my friends and I never really thought it would actually happen until we saw them that evening. Looking back, I wish I could say that I remember it like it was yesterday, but I don't. That gig seems like it was a long, long time ago. In some ways, the Roses really were a remnant of my school years and seeing them that evening was the beginning

of the end of that time period. Still, I wouldn't have missed it for anything. It wasn't the greatest show I've ever seen, but like my friend Scott says, "I just HAD to see the Stone Roses before I DIE."

I cannot remember the set list any more, but it consisted of the songs that they were playing around this time. No Tears though - they did this in the soundcheck that I listened to, from outside the venue. The set was dissed somehow in the press (I managed to find one review for it) but I thought it was marvellous. Ian kept quite well in tune and the band played very well. Ian was better in the soundcheck, though (they ran through at least Waterfall apart from Tears).

I have always wanted to find a tape of this show - nobody seems to have taped it, even though there was practically no security. You cannot overestimate how massive The Stone Roses are/were in Aberdeen. When the announcement was made in July 1995 that they were playing 2 gigs in Glasgow and 1 in Aberdeen, no-one could believe it - they were playing here. Not even in the biggest venue but certainly the best.

The queue for tickets was unbelievable. Our lot were the first outside Aberdeen Box Office (next door to the Music Hall, incidentally) at about half eleven pm (the doors were due to open at 9am) but by 4am there were hundreds of people waiting to make sure they got their hands on some. The cops were asking us who the hell The Stone Roses were. They couldn't believe they'd never heard of a band that caused this much fuss. The local newspaper 'Evening Express' carried on the front page the following day a photo of us queuing up with the headline "Why Stone Roses grow on you".

After that it was a case of waiting for December. The old bootlegs were getting more airplay the closer we got to the date. Pessimists saying that it would never live up to the hype that was being created locally and then the day came.

I've never seen an atmosphere like it at a gig in my life (I've been to a fair few). When the lights went down and the intro to Breaking Into Heaven was on, everyone was screaming the place down. Then they appeared (Ian Brown wearing an Aberdeen FC sunhat) and the Music Hall went berserk. The whole place was bouncing. Even up in the seated balcony everyone was on their feet. Squire's guitar rocked the joint, even Ian's voice sounded brilliant aided with the backing vocals of 1,500 others. They were all very receptive to the reaction. Mani got involved in some football banter "Thanks for Alex Ferguson" which started a huge 'Aberdeen, Aberdeen, Aberdeen' chant only to be drowned out by the intro to Love Spreads. Brilliant. They came back on for an encore of I Am The Resurrection in their dressing gowns after which Ian screamed "Thank You, Scotland rules, you're fucking rocking." Then he threw Robbie Maddix's drumsticks into the crowd. This, of course was their first time in Scotland since Glasgow Green and they seemed to enjoy themselves (more so than at Sheffield Arena, which I also went to).

Afterwards, everyone I spoke to talked about how the Roses had exceeded all expectations. They were phenomenal that night. It all fell into place. Me and my mate managed to get backstage somehow and met the band (except for John Squire who Mani said was "Away being shy somewhere"). Tapped a bit for a joint off Ian Brown and spilled Mani's beer which capped off one of the greatest nights of my life and that of a thousand others.

Is it really seven years? Bloody hell. Seven years since 'The Barras', twelve since 'The Green'. God, I am only 27. Now I don't know if this fits into gig review or eye witness accounts but here is how I saw and heard it that night and what a journey it was.

Ticketless, gutted and desperate to go, I had to listen to the one lucky bam in our factory who managed to secure a ticket weeks earlier rant on about how it would be the gig of the year, better than 'The Green' and better than any similar gig in this or any other year. In a way, I hated his daily rantings in my direction but also had the same fear that 'He may be right'. This gig I had to go to.

So it came the 20th December 1995. 4.30pm and we clock off the dayshift. My good mate 'Grapey' and myself are standing sour-faced and sullen as we can't find a ticket in the whole of the West of Scotland...well, not for under 150 quid. I don't know what made us jump on the train and head straight into Glasgow that night, but it seemed a good idea at the time. We had no tickets, hardly much cash and no way of getting back home. It would be eventful, that's for sure.

On reaching the Gallowgate at about 6.45pm, the place was absolutely buzzing. Mop Tops everywhere, T-shirts and Beanie hats as far as you could see. 'The Barras' is always in good spirits on gig nights but it was absolutely electric. 'Resurrection' was pumping out of 'Baird's Bar' and 'The Saracen's Head' was singing along across the other side of the street. There were fans everywhere. Probably more without tickets than had, and to go along with them, touts in every door every 10 yards.

"200 quid per pair" was the first quote we got; a polite "No thanks" was the reply this Mancunian got. And then anything from 70 pounds to 120 pounds a single ticket and then the guy who was really taking the biscuit claiming to all

who listened 250 pounds would get them backstage for the full night. "Aye right ye are mate". Finally we decided it was a lost cause - we had 50 pounds each. Sure, one of us could have got in if we chipped together, but who would it be?

As we walked away a small tap on the shoulder changed the night completely. "Are you guys wanting in there?" He was about 5 ft 2", 60 year old and not very well dressed. He had a nice wee wooly bunnet on his head. "Aye we want in but they're wanting 80 pounds each, we cannae afford it Mr?"

"How much can ye afford? Coz I can get ye in, without a ticket. All these punters are daft, they should just have spoken to me!"

After a little discussion and to assess whether we thought this Jake was the full shilling or not we decided we could afford 30 pounds each.

"30 pounds each," I stated, waiting on him knocking me back. "But you don't get the cash until we are in that building at the top of the stairs walking into the arena. How you getting us in anyway?"

"The wife she works the ticket booth, she phoned me a wee while ago. Come down she said I have the guestlist in front of me. You escort as many as you like past the security, come over to the booth I will sign them in, no questions asked. The guy on the door is cool with it, will give him something later for his trouble. It's going to be a goldmine she said".

Well this wee chap's wife was right. A goldmine it certainly was, he was unwilling to discuss how many he had previously taken in and for how much but you just knew a lot of those high-to-do guestlist punters weren't getting in. Good enough for them I say, they should buy a ticket like everybody else.

So we starts the walk, past the security door as he said, up to the booth where the woman asks:

"Who is this then the Wullie?"

"It's Billy and Billy," the wee guy replies, and the wife duly scores another two names off the list. I nearly wet myself. Coz I knew we were only 20 yards away from getting in. And 'Grapey' and myself did our best to keep our laughter in.

We then went past the final ticket check with the words:

"On the guest list Hen, I've to show them where the hall was"

We were ushered through I couldnae believe it, walking up the stairs getting greeted by the oversized picture of Wendy James that's still there to this day into the Bar area by the cloakroom.

"Well how easy was that?" asks our new friend.

"No bother big man" and I gave him the 60 pounds as promised.

"You guys have a good night, I've some friends to be seeing," and away he went never to be seen again.

Now think of this. The guy has probably been taking people in all night, from around 7pm - 9pm say, when the band come on. The whole process took about five mins from intro to inside, most people probably gave him more than the 30 pounds each we did and he probably wouldn't accept any less. You lot do the math, a great night's work on his part. We were now in the gig of the year.

20 pounds left in my pocket meant 10 pounds for a T-shirt, two beers and bus fare up the road with a fish supper. See the gig first of course.

When the Roses do appear at roughly 9.15pm the place goes absolutely ape-shit electric and we cannot help talking about 1990 'The Green' and how this will compare. At 'The Green' though, I am only 15. It is the third ever concert of my life, too many idiots are out of their tree for my liking, the band play good but not great, the sound is muffled slightly and it is more about the event and not the music and that has never sat well with me, even to this day. Somewhat cheated was how I felt by the whole thing. And quite clearly at this time of his career Ian Brown could not sing live for his dinner at his aunties. A FACT.

But tonight. Tonight will eclipse 'The Green' and there are many factors and opinions I will put forward for this.

1. We are at 'The Barras'. Now it can get a bit cliched at times but it is simply the best venue in the UK. If the band is only half good the night is never wasted as the atmosphere always takes over. If the band is amazing as is the case tonight it is always one of those gigs you keep harking on about to your mates. This still happens to this day. Fifteen of us went to 'The Green', and we hardly ever talk about that.

2. Musically the Roses in my opinion are far better by miles than they were in 1990. Now all you purists can buzz off. 'Second Coming' has much better music and lyrics than are present on 'The Stone Roses' (except for 'This Is The One' which is the best Roses tune ever). This will help provide us with a better set than what we witnessed five years ago and also we have a front man who is now confident in his voice and can deliver a top notch performance. (To Liam Gallagher, In your dreams mate).

3. The shenanigans and thrill of no ticket and how we entered the venue have given me a high factor of 1000. At 'The Green' most of the highs were 'Too High' if you know what I mean. Too many wasted punters. The whole night tonight seems meant to be.

4. The Roses get to play 'Ten Storey Love Song'. Now I have been to in excess of 100 gigs at 'Glasgow Barras' since I was 14. The only song played live I have seen in this venue which comes close is 'Motorcycle Emptiness' by the Manics. The last gig when there were four of them, if you know what I'm on about. It is simply one of the best moments I have ever witnessed at a gig. 'The Green' did not have a moment like this. Sure it had good moments but none musically or spiritually outstanding. I say no more. Let Ian Brown sing.

And for the rest of the gig, well, we get: 'Drums', 'Adored', 'Waterfall', 'Elizabeth' and the super brilliant 'Love Spreads' which transforms into a mega-Mofo of a song. This was the best 90 mins of that year and I had a few as 'The Mighty Motherwell' did of course win the Cup that year.

And then they were gone. Back to little 'Roses Land'. We jumped on the bus via the chip shop and walked into work proud as punch the next day.

I was fifteen at the time and this was the event me and my mates had been waiting for since early summer when tickets went on sale. Like everyone else, we got down to the Apollo before the doors opened and joined the longest, most over-excited queue I've ever waited in outside a gig. Typically, it was pissing it down, but everyone was far too hyper to care.

The atmosphere inside the Apollo was one of total anticipation, I still couldn't believe they were actually going to turn up. The wait seemed to go on forever, the excitement really began to build once the stage was set up. The sound system was playing a lot of dancey, northern soul stuff. The lights went down and the machines started to cough out tonnes of smoke. The recorded intro to Breaking into Heaven kicked in, but still no Roses. I was right down the front in the pit and after a couple of minutes the stage was totally covered by the smoke, the searchlights waving madly. By this point the crowd was totally frantic, everyone craning to see through the smoke.

As the bass kicked in to I Wanna Be Adored, I could just about pick out the shape of John Squire. The smoke cleared to reveal Ian Brown, face framed by Parka hood, staring out into the crowd. John's guitar kicked in, 4,000 ecstatic Mancs singing every note.

To be honest, the start of the gig may be etched into my memory, but the rest of it is a bit of a blur. It was the most energetic, excited crowd I've been in, at one point, possibly during She Bangs The Drums, my section of the pit fell to the floor domino-style. Ian's voice was excellent, at least to me (one reason why I'll never listen to the bootleg) except at the start of Your Star Will Shine when he'd had a smoke. The band was tight, and louder than anyone else I've seen at the Apollo. The Daybreak/Breaking Into Heaven section was heavy and the transition between the songs was wonderful. The Tears guitar change-over is really clear in my mind. They did I Am The Resurrection as the encore, Ian saying 'What do you want for Christmas?' or something similar, half the crowd shouting for Resurrection, the other half for Sally Cinnamon. I'm sure the crowd's singing to Resurrection could be heard a couple of miles away. The lights came on, The Fozz played, and that was it.

It was the best gig I had seen, and probably always will be. I'll never listen to the bootleg, and only play others from that tour very occasionally. Sometimes memory is better than reality.

I can't rate the quality of the performance, I was too excited. The band was a legend, a dream, they were my heroes, could never ever had lived up to my expectations, but that night they did. I will always wish I could have seen them in 89/90, but that's just greed, I'm more than lucky to have seen them once.

Older and wiser (see *Glasgow Green 1990 entry*), I saw them at Sheffield at the end of the Second Coming tour.

Memory fully active this time, I was treated to the sad (but you just knew he'd be alright and it was funny) sight of Shaun Ryder reading his lyrics from a sheet of paper, repeating the same line so many times the whole band turned to look at him, and Kermit the rapper (I think) bouncing across the stage to give him a dunt during Black Grape supporting. He then started singing the rest of the song, like a skipping record. He totally wasn't there for a good 30 seconds.

Lights went down, Breaking Into Heaven intro comes on, the obviously not very matey Roses (well, three quarters of them) appeared, Adored starts, all looks great, then the drummer starts his best Guns N Roses impersonation. Don't know how you feel about the 'non proper' lineup but it didn't sound too good from a drumming perspective. Ian Brown fluffed a few lines, regularly didn't try to hit a high note, always seeming to sing them an octave lower than even the audience. Kept making high pitched monkey noises. Mani looked like a man possessed, I think knowing what we do now he could see this might be the second last show (with Squire). As far as I know he was already lined up for Primal Scream if it went wrong after he realised John Squire was writing songs and keeping them to himself. Squire was dressed like my Grandad, I was right up against the barrier directly in front of him. Played well.

Of course, after the next gig the descent accelerated toward the sticky end.

I felt that they'd lost more than a quarter when they lost Reni, it was like individually they needed each other to get to the higher level. More than the sum of the parts. The power of four.

I do remember I never once looked at the drummer once he got going, I was so appalled, and I think John Squire looked to his right once, to check Mani

was ready with an acoustic, nothing like the videos where the whole group regularly look to each other during the performance. Mates no more.

Overall though, really enjoyed it, ignored the drums, had half of my body on the cover of NME (believe me, I didn't even keep it, other than the guys I was with, nobody in the world would have known it was me) and left happy. Ears ringing, dressed in a t-shirt in the snow. In retrospect, it was disappointing not to hear new songs, I'd hoped they'd come back quickly but after managing to write only four songs in a year (the interview at Blackpool showed they'd already got One Love going then, and Fool's Gold was supposed to be a four track EP) then doing the massive disappearing act, that was asking too much!

Goes without saying, if the four ever got back together, even if it was for one song and they played at the top of Everest, I'd make sure I was there.
